A LOOK BACK

Open BNP Paribas Banque de Bretagne (Quimper, France): Benoit Paire extended his ATP Challenger Tour-leading win-loss mark to 14-1 in 2015, downing countryman Gregoire Barrere

6-4, 3-6, 6-4 in Quimper. The Frenchman has reached three finals in four weeks, claiming a pair of titles. He needed one hour and 41 minutes to defeat Barrere for his fifth career crown.

Paire, who becomes the third different Frenchman to emerge victorious in the five-year history of the event, makes his Top 100 return with the win. Wild card Barrere, 21, was contesting just his third tournament on the Challenger circuit.

Paire: "I really thank everyone, the organisation, the ball kids, the

WHAT'S AHEAD

The 10th edition of the Cachantun Cup, in Santiago, Chile, welcomes back two former champions in third seed Maximo Gonzalez (2009, '11) and fourth seed Facundo Bagnis (2013). Joao Souza leads the field and Alejandro Gonzalez is seeded second.

Guangzhou hosts the fourth China International, as top seed Blaz Kavcic and Kazakhstan's Davis Cup hero Aleksandr Nedovyesov travel to the Far East. Teenage phenom Hyeon Chung is also present, as are 2014 runner-up Yuichi Sugita and 2011 finalist Alexander Kudryavtsev.
